



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Central Council of Mayors has undertaken this study to provide implementation guidance for the newly established STP-Shared Fund. The objective of this summary is to collaborate with Central Council communities, identify projects, and develop a path towards maximizing the potential of STP-Shared Fund projects within the Central Council of Mayors.

BACKGROUND

The distribution of funding within the Federal-aid Surface Transportation Program (STP) has recently undergone a series of changes. In 2018, the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) implemented changes to this program with the intent at improving its effectiveness across the Chicagoland region. One of these changes resulted in creation of the STP-Shared Fund.

The STP-Shared Fund was established with the goal of allocating funds towards projects that result in regional benefit. Since the size, cost, and multi-jurisdictional nature of regional-benefit projects often make it difficult to finance and advance within the traditional STP program, CMAP implemented creation of this Shared Fund to target aid towards transportation regional benefit. STP-Shared Fund projects will have the following general eligibility requirements as designated by CMAP:

* Joint application from at least 3 local partners, including at least one municipality

OR

*Total project cost of \$5 million or more

Projects will be competitively scored with CMAP's application methodology and evaluated by the STP-Shared Fund Selection Committee

Project types will consist of the following categories:

- Road Reconstructions: Projects that address condition deficiencies on the road network and do not add
 roadway capacity
- Transit Station Rehabilitation/Reconstructions: Projects that enhance the existing transit system by improving or reconstructing transit stations
- Bridge Rehabilitation/Reconstructions: Projects that address condition deficiencies on the region's bridges
- Highway/Rail Grade Crossing Improvements: Projects that reduce delay at highway/rail crossings, through grade separation or other improvements
- Road Expansions: Projects that add capacity to an existing road or involve construction of a new road
- Bus Speed Improvements: Projects that improve the speed and reliability of bus travel in the region
- Corridor-Level or Small Area Safety Improvements: Projects that address safety issues
- Truck Route Improvements: Projects that improve truck movement through a corridor or area

The STP-Shared Fund now consists of 15% of the overall STP funding within CMAP with 85% remaining in a STP-Local Fund. Additional guidance on the establishment and scoring of the STP-Shared Fund can be found at https://www.cmap.illinois.gov/committees/advisory/council-of-Shared Fund can be found at https://www.cmap.illinois.gov/committees/advisory/council-of-Shared Fund call for projects was in late 2018 with the Central Council being awarded two (2) projects that will benefit regional transportation.

In addition to the STP-Shared fund, the Central Council has undertaken changes to its STP-Local program. In accordance with CMAP's recommendations within the Chicagoland area, the Central Council adopted new methodology for allocating STP-Local projects on September 25,

2019. This methodology included provisions to fund Preliminary Design (Phase I and II) for projects that are identified for the STP-Shared Fund. The benefit of this action is that local agencies within the Central Council may advance their potential Shared Fund projects with a successful STP-Local application. Traditionally, STP funds for preliminary engineering are difficult to obtain, so this aspect of the methodology is of great benefit to Central Council communities.

Looking forward to future STP-Shared funding availability, the initial preliminary schedule and allocation was considered for this program:

*As of December 2019, targeted funding calls for specific categories in 2021 will no longer be considered and **all project types will be eligible**. In addition, a category for Major Trails, Bike Facilities, and Pedestrian Access is being considered for future calls.

PURPOSE

Changes in the way STP funding will be distributed changes the resultant project awards within the Central Council. The development of the STP-Shared Fund for regionally significant projects will result in less financing for local projects that have traditionally been funded within the Council: locally focused streets, intersection capacity, trail, and transit improvements along established Federal Aid Urban (FAU) Routes. This, however, creates new opportunity for projects of regional significance in and around the Central Council.

This change in STP allocation resulted in the Central Council looking for improved ways to advance projects and maximize funding.

It was determined that an essential component for maximum funding to the area was to identify projects early that may benefit the region. As a result of this need, the Council obtained Illinois Statewide Planning & Research Funds towards developing this transportation plan focused on STP-Shared fund projects moving forward.

The intent of this plan is to collaborate with Central Council communities and identify potential Shared Fund projects that can benefit the region and develop a blueprint toward advancing these projects in the area.

PROCESS

Development of the plan consisted of the following steps:

- Reviewing existing plans within the Central Council region. The following is a list of plans reviewed as part of this task:
 - IDOT Multi-year plan
 - Cook County Transportation Plan
 - Invest in Cook Funding plan
 - Local Agency Comprehensive Plans
 - Local Agency Bike and Pedestrian Plans
 - WCMC Active Transportation Plan
 - Metra Strategic Plan
 - Pace's Vision 2020 Plan
- Conduct interviews with each member community of the Central Council of Mayors for the purpose of confirming potential shared fund projects, review master plans and studies, brainstorm potential new shared fund projects, and document local projects that could obtain funding. Obtain a preferred prioritization of the projects identified.
- Provide review to agencies outside the Central Council such as IDOT, Cook County, Pace, Metra, CTA. Create and further develop project concepts based on available resources.
- Compile Data
- Provide data analysis for Shared Fund projects that include potential scoring, identifying ways to improve scoring, and approximate costs.
- Provide Recommendations. Analysis was provided on the anticipated Shared Fund scoring methodology:



FINDINGS SUMMARY

A summary of all potential Shared Fund and STP projects identified as part of this outreach and coordination effort is as follows:



STP-SHARED FUND PROJECT ANALYSIS

Projects identified for Shared Fund analysis were based on the preferred project type and best scoring opportunity to obtain funding. The following potential Shared Fund projects, scoring, and project details have been identified within the Central Council as part of this outreach effort:

SHARED FUND PROJECT TARGET (BRIDGE): CHICAGO PORTAGE HISTORIC SITE/FPDCC PEDESTRIAN CONNECTION – SUMMIT (LEAD), LYONS, FOREST VIEW, STICKNEY, FPDDCC, COOK COUNTY, IDOT



Description: Recommendations set forth as part of the 2018 Chicago Portage National Historic Site Master Plan by Forest Preserve District of Cook County identified key connection deficiencies to Central Council Communities, most notably Summit, Forest View, Stickney, and Lyons. The primary barrier for surrounding communities was access along Harlem Avenue over the Sanitary and Ship Canal. The Shared Fund component include structure modifications would necessary to accommodate pedestrian and trail connectivity to communities south of the canal. The benefits of this improvement are numerous, including future connection to the 1&M Canal, increasing the recreational benefit of surrounding trail users, and eliminating connectivity barriers for adjacent communities.

Scope: Improve Pedestrian/Trail Connectivity to National Historic Site and FPDCC Ottawa Trail Woods

Action for Improved Scoring:

• Immediately confirm direction of IDOT's ongoing study for Harlem Avenue structure modifications (as per previous FPDCC study).

- Confirm IDOT's current property acquisition progress to add 10 points
- Obtain support for this project from Southwest Council of Mayors
- Green Infrastructure suggestions include trail infiltration trenches, bio-swales, an open drainage system, permeable pavement, and green construction techniques.
- Confirm IDOT's scope towards accommodating pedestrians can maximize Financial Commitment to 5 points. IDOT current MYP includes rehabilitation:

Next Steps:

- Immediately confirm ongoing IDOT project scope of improvements. Determine extent of trail/pedestrian connections.
- Amend or complete a federal aid Phase I. As an alternative, complete a feasibility study for an improved crossing. Consider Invest in Cook, RTA Community Planning and CMAP LTA funds.

SHARED FUND PROJECT TARGET (BUS): HARLEM AVENUE PACE PULSE CORRIDOR INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS – BERWYN, STICKNEY, FOREST VIEW, SUMMIT, LYONS, RIVERSIDE

Description: The corridor along Harlem Avenue within the Central Council has been identified as a "near-term" Pace Pulse priority. New bus platforms, rapid transit technology, and related Pace Bus facilities are proposed to improve commuter traffic in the region.

Scope: Improvements anticipated under this potential Shared Fund project include providing the infrastructure necessary for local communities to connect and appropriately adjust infrastructure to accommodate new Pace facilities.



Description: The corridor along Cermak Road within the Central Council has been identified as a "near-term" Pace Pulse priority. New bus rapid platforms, transit technology, and related facilities Pace Bus are to proposed improve commuter traffic in the region.

Scope: Improvements anticipated under this potential Shared Fund project include providing the infrastructure necessary for local communities to connect and appropriately adjust infrastructure to accommodate new Pace facilities.




SHARED FUND PROJECT TARGET (BUS): LA GRANGE ROAD PACE PULSE CORRIDOR INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS – LA GRANGE PARK, LA GRANGE, COUNTRYSIDE, HODGKINS, BROOKFIELD



Description: The corridor along La Grange Road within the Central Council has been identified as a "mid-term" Pace Pulse priority. New bus platforms, rapid transit technology, and related Pace Bus facilities are proposed to improve commuter traffic in the region.

Scope: Improvements anticipated under this potential Shared Fund project include providing the infrastructure necessary for local communities to connect and appropriately adjust infrastructure to accommodate new Pace facilities.

Estimated Scoring:



(Projects scoring over 60 points in 2019 Call for Projects had an increased funding probability over others)

Action for Improved Scoring:

- Perform an evaluation to determine preferred improvements surrounding new Pace infrastructure, including lighting, sidewalks, trails, underground utilities, drainage, intersections, and drainage concerns.
- Coordinate timing with Pace to determine ROW and Readiness of project
- Confirm Pace timing to maximize points in Financial Commitments (adding 5 points)
- Obtain support for this project from Southwest Council of Mayors and adjacent communities outside the Central Council

- Confirm Pace progress on development of Pace Pulse route and site specific improvements
- Confirm community responsibilities for accommodating new Pace infrastructure

Description: Berwyn's #1 priority project is a heavily used FAU collector street that spans jurisdictions of Cicero, IDOT, and Pace and currently in Phase I design. It may also be considered rehabilitation or safety improvements, depending on timing of the application process. Expanding the existing Phase I scope may also be considered in the future.

Scope: Signals, pedestrian safety, roadway safety, resurfacing, patching, reconstruction (possible), curb and gutter, sidewalk, and utilities.

SHARED FUND PROJECT TARGET (RECONSTRUCTION): 26TH STREET FAU REHABILITATION – BERWYN (LEAD), CICERO, N. RIVERSIDE, RIVERSIDE, IDOT

Description: Berwyn's 26th Street is a heavily used FAU collector street that spans jurisdictions of Cicero, IDOT, North Riverside, and Riverside. Due to the size and essential function of this corridor, funding is needed to advance this critical link forward. Preliminary Engineering has not been started.

Scope: Signals, pedestrian safety, roadway safety, resurfacing, patching, reconstruction (possible), curb and gutter, sidewalk, and utilities.

- Additional funding, such as Invest in Cook, could increase Financial Commitment Score to 5 points.

• Complete Phase I, potentially using STP-Local Central Council funds.

SHARED FUND PROJECT TARGET (RECONSTRUCTION): OAK PARK AVENUE REHABILITATION – BERWYN, STICKNEY, FOREST VIEW



Description: Oak Park Avenue spans the jurisdictions of Berwyn, Forest View, and Stickney. This heavily traveled FAU Route is in various stages of repair. A comprehensive approach to the entire corridor can set this project up to be completed in manageable stages. This roadway is an essential and proven Regional Corridor and can be an ideal locally-led Shared Fund project.

Scope: Signals, pedestrian safety, roadway safety, resurfacing, patching, reconstruction curb and gutter, sidewalk, and utilities.

- Initiating Phase I with ROW can improve readiness by 10 points
- Ensure vision of Green Infrastructure is followed to maximize points as scored. Green Infrastructure elements could include infiltration parkways, reduction of permeable surfaces, and sustainable plantings.

- Examine the possibility of increased Complete Streets points (Max of 10)
- Freight Data may increase scoring in this category to 5 points
- Depending on Preferred Alternative, Complete Streets could be increased to a maximum of 10 points.
- Additional funding, such as Invest in Cook, could increase Financial Commitment Score to 5 points.

Next Steps:

- Confirm partnership with adjacent communities.
- Complete Phase I, potentially using STP-Local Central Council or Invest in Cook funds.


SHARED FUND PROJECT TARGET (RECONSTRUCTION): 55TH STREET IMPROVEMENTS – COUNTRYSIDE, LA GRANGE, WESTERN SPRINGS, MC COOK, COOK COUNTY, IDOT



Description: 55th Street Improvements, which is led by IDOT, spans several Central Council communities:

Countryside, La Grange, Western Springs, McCook. As part of these improvements, IDOT will be requesting cost participation for facilities that are the responsibility of local agencies. These facilities may include sidewalk, utilities, lighting, drainage, multi-use trail, signals, and emergency preemption. Appropriate timing will need to be closely

coordinated with IDOT and the Shared Fund call for projects to successfully obtain funding for



this project.

Scope: IDOT local participation for signals, sidewalks, signals, trails, lighting, and utilities.

Description: Plainfield Road Improvements, which is led by Cook County, spans several Central Council communities: Countryside, Indian Head Park, La Grange, Western Springs, and McCook. Cook County is initiating a Phase I study and it's anticipated that cost participation will be

requested for facilities that are the responsibility of local agencies. These facilities may include sidewalk, utilities, lighting, drainage, multi-use trail, signals, and emergency preemption. Appropriate timing will need to be closely coordinated with the County and the Shared Fund call for projects to successfully obtain funding for this project.

Scope: County local participation for signals, sidewalks, signals, trails, lighting, and utilities.

Description: I-294 Improvements, which is led by the Illinois Tollway, spans an impactful area for Central Council communities. The Tollway has ongoing work within this important corridor that is affecting adjacent communities. The intent of this project is to provide funding for adjacent I-294 communities in order to improve the infrastructure resulting from the demand and increase traffic from these improvements.

Scope: Tollway local participation requirements, local environmental impacts, stormwater impacts, unexpected infrastructure needs, and transportation needs.



This route receives a high percentage of trucks diverting from local highways and bypassing preferred corridors. The purpose of this project is to obtain the means for the Village to pursue an improvement that benefits the region and local trucking operations.

Scope: Roadway and related improvements within this trucking corridor.

Description: Ogden Avenue is a heavily traveled state highway through the heart of the western suburbs. Over time, this route has developed numerous deficiencies within the Village of Brookfield that have impacted safety, traffic operations, utilities, and adjacent businesses. The purpose of this project is to improve infrastructure, safety operations, and aesthetics within this vital corridor.

Scope: Intersection and Pedestrian safety, streetscaping, utility improvements



Description: 47th and East Avenue Improvements, which is led by IDOT, spans several Central Council communities: Countryside, La Grange, and McCook, along with the Cook County highway system. As part of these improvements, IDOT will be requesting cost participation for facilities that are the responsibility of local agencies. These facilities may include sidewalk, utilities, lighting, drainage, multi-use trail, signals, and emergency preemption. Appropriate timing will need



to be closely coordinated with IDOT and the Shared Fund call for projects to successfully obtain funding for this project.

Scope: IDOT local participation for signals, sidewalks, signals, trails, lighting, and utilities.

- Incorporating Green Infrastructure could increase scoring
- Confirming/Adding complete streets elements can improve scoring
- Confirm scope of Local Agencies and verify funding eligibility, such as lighting and utility work

- Current IDOT timetable is unknown. Confirm IDOT timetable and potential to coordinate with next call for Shared Fund.
- Coordinate with adjacent communities and scope of IDOT non-participation items.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

Shared Fund

- 1) Confirm and achieve consensus on Priority and Timing for STP-Shared Funding applications.
- 2) Perform advanced coordination with jurisdictional agencies Pace, IDOT, County, scope, timing, and participation levels to achieve higher scoring.
- 3) Coordinate concurrence with adjacent Councils on bordering Shared Fund Projects. CMAP recommended this action to further improve scoring and increase regional benefit.
- 4) Obtain and leverage additional funding within projects and advance early phases of preliminary design.
- 5) Confirm and execute advanced and targeted scoring improvements from the preliminary scoring and Action for Improved Scoring.
- 6) Continually update region priorities within the Central Council and append this document.

STP-Local and other Identified Projects

- 1) Confirm Priority and Timing of each project within a community to establish a blueprint for implementation. A tentative Priority List can be found in the Appendix.
- 2) Aggressively pursue funding opportunities based on the progress achieved in each individual project and recommendations for funding (see Appendix). Consider funding sunset clauses of where funding eligibility may expire.
- 3) Advance early phases of projects with the understanding that progress achieved will rank projects higher in scoring methodology.
- 4) Continually update funding needs and project list as needed. Consider additions to the Federal Aid route map which can be made eligible for Federal Funding.

Approval and Updating this Plan:

Adoption of this plan by the Central Council will sufficiently satisfy CMAP requirements for plan inclusion and allow communities to maximize planning points for Shared Fund applications.

Amending this plan by the Central Council can accommodate any future necessary modifications. The following are suggested methods to account for future changes:

- Project Additions and Subtractions: This plan is designed to be efficiently updated with simple modifications to the STP-Shared Fund and Transportation Plan Map. Revisions to this map can be made and approved on a case by case or a regular scheduled (2 year suggested) basis. This process will allow the plan to be sufficiently flexible for future funding opportunities and changes in community priorities.
- Refreshed Community Outreach and more Extensive Plan Revisions: Statewide Planning and Research Funds are currently being used to fund this report and it is anticipated that a future request for this same funding will be made when more extensive changes are needed. It is estimated that this request will be made approximately every 5 years.


CONCLUSION






VILLAGE OF MCCOOK






